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Descendants of

FRANCIS BAKER OF YARMOUTH

1 Francis Baker, tailor, embarked on the ship Planter of London on 2 Apr. 1635; bringing a certificate from the minister of Great St. Albans, Hertfordshire, England, and giving his age as twenty-four. His parentage is not definitely known. He may have been the Francis Baker, son of Thomas, who was christened at St. James Clerkenwell, London, 7 July 1612. The age agrees exactly, and St. Albans is only twenty miles from London. Thomas Baker's wife was Frances Ingram, whom he married at St. James Clerkenwell 24 Aug. 1592.

The Planter was bound for Boston, and in that town Francis baker resided for several years. On 1 June 1641 he received a grant of land near Follen's Pond in Nobscusset Territory, now Yarmouth, on Cape Cod. This land is now within the bounds of Dennis? On 17 June 16415 (sixteen days after getting this grant) Francis was married to Isabel, daughter of William Twining. This is the first marriage of record at Yarmouth, and it lasted for

fifty-five years.

The young couple lived in Boston until after the birth of their first child in 1642, but removed to Yarmouth before the second child was born in 16454 In 1658 Francis had a grant of ten acres of land fifteen miles to the eastward, near land of his father-in-law in Eastham. The Bakers were living on this land in 1659, but soon sold it to William Twining, Jr., and returned to their Yarmouth farm. There Francis spent the rest of his life, being variously described in the town's records as cooper, blacksmith, and surveyor. He died 23 July 169610 aged eighty-five. Isabel lived nearly ten years longer, dying 16 May 1706. Francis' will, written 4 Mar. 1693 and proved 10 Dec. 1696, mentions sons John, Daniel, and William: the eldest son of son Nathaniel, deceased; and daughters Elizabeth Chase and Hannah Pearse. He signed by his mark, which was a capital F written above a capital B. Wife Isabel and son Thomas were named as joint executors.

He seems to have died without issue before 4 Mar. 1693, since neither he nor any heir to represent him is named in his father's will. All his brothers and sisters were named or represented. Samuel was a soldier in King Philip's War, marching in the second Narragansett expedition, in which was fought the bloody "Swamp-Fort" battle on 19 Dec.1675 near the site of what is now West Kingston, R.I. For this service he was later paid £4-10s2
- 4 4 Daniel 2 Sept. 1650 (Elizabeth Chase)
- 5 Hannah. It is probable -- almost certain -- that she married Abraham Peirce (born Jan. 1638; died Jan. 1718) son of Abraham and Rebecca. She is called Hannah Pearse in her father's will: it is known that Abraham had an earlier wife than Hannah Glass, Twhom he married in 1695; and two of Abraham's sisters married two of Hannah Baker's brothers. Hannah (Baker) Peirce must have died between 4 Mar. 1693, the date of her father's will, and 29 Oct.1695, the date of her husband's second marriage.

- 2 Nathaniel 2, son of Francis and Isabel (Twining), was born in Boston 27 Mar. 1642. He lived at Yarmouth.) His tax in 1676 "for paying for the late war" was £1-14-2. His wife's name is not known. She was not, as has been claimed, Desire 2 Gray (Edward). Desire married Mathaniel Southworth in 1670 and was still his wife in 1683 Nor was she, as also claimed, Sarah Lane. Sarah married another Hathaniel Eaker, born much earlier and of Hingham. Nathaniel of Yarmouth and his widow both died in December 1691.4

They lived in the part of Yarmouth that became South Dennis. In 1676, when the land-owners were taxed to pay for King Philip's War, John's tax was £1-2s.; his father's was £2-6-9: his older brother Nathaniel's was £1-14-2; and his younger brother Daniel's £0-13-9-2 all in exact proportion to age! John's will was written 25 Apr. 17126 and was proved 2 July of the same year 7 His wife Alice was alive when the will was written, and was mentioned by name. It is often erroneously stated that Alice had died in 1673 -- an error that probably originated from the fact that Savage places Alice's baptismal date close beside her father's death date, which was 1673; and that his date has been taken for hers

South Dennis, known now as the Judah Baker House, was built by Daniel. He was a Quaker. The Friends! records at Newport Historical Society show that he was present as a delegate to the Newport Man's Meet ing held at Portsmouth 25 Apr. 1708. Daniel and his brother William were among the Yarmouth men sent on the first Narragansett expedition. They set out for Mount Hope, near what is now Bristol, R.I., on 24 June 1675 Finding the enemy no longer there, they moved on into Massachusetts and were gone on a fourteen-week campaign. For this service Daniel was paid £3-3s; William, £8-11s > In 1686 the Legislature voted grants of land to all who had fought in this war, but was so slow in confirming the grants that when the final confirmation was given in 1735, out of the thirty-nine Yarmouth men who had fought only two were still alive: William Chase and Richard Taylor. It was the heirs of the others who received the grants, all which were at Gorham, Maine & Daniel's heirs drew lot 107; and William's, lot IR. 43. Their brother Samuel's heirs drew lot 79.4 No. death record for Daniel or for his wife Elizabeth has been found. The last that we know of Daniel is that on 8 Apr. 1711 he was made administrator of the estate of John Pugsley; and that on 20 July 1713 he was of the signatories to a deed &

There is no real evidence to show that Ebenezer, Silas, and William were sons of Daniel and Elizabeth. Daniel's family has never been fully assembled by any genealogist. In so far as known or conjecturable, the birth years of his children have been given as follows:

Now, it is not quite natural to suppose that no children were born in the long gap between 1683 and 1696. Ebenezer, who married in 1715 and, like Daniel, lived in Dennis, would fit into this long space very well, as would also two others; especially Silas, whose intention to marry Lydia Earle was entered at the Newport Man's Meeting of 31 July 1722.—the same Quaker group at which a few years earlier Daniel's son Elisha had entered his intention to marry Mary Earle, sister to this Lydia. Nothing further is known of either Silas or Lydia. As to William, whom we have entered as # 19 above, one notes that he settled at Harwich, where Daniel's daughter Thankful also lived.

We are placing these three sons here only tentatively, hoping that by so doing some reader may be led to make further investigations which may conclusively prove or disprove this hypothesis.

5 Thomas 2, son of Francis and Isabel (Twining), was born in 1654/5. He married about 1699 a woman named Bath-sheba. It has been suggested with a high degree of

Bashua Lewis born October 1667, daughter of George and Mary (Lumbard). Eashua Lewis married first 10 Aug. 1690 John O'Kelia, who died in 1695 Thomas Baker was the son to whom most of the father's property was left--possibly because the other sons had been provided for, Thomas being the only one still unmarried at the time of his father's death. Thomas and his mother were made joint executors of the father's will. Thomas lived at Yarmouth and shared in the division of common lands there in 1712, after which we find no further trace of him.

William married second Mercy, born 4 Dec. 1671, daughter of George and Elizabeth (Crispe) Lawrence of Watertown. William's will was written 16 July and proved 14 Aug. 1727, His widow Mercy died 26 Jan. 1753.

1670. He married 30 July 1702 Elizabeth Berry, born
21 Dec. 1684. daughter of John and Susanna (Growell) 4
and lived at Yarmouth. He and sons Samuel and Judah
shared in the 1739 division of common lands at
Crockett Neck. His will, written 3 May 1743 & proved
6 May 1755. does not mention a wife; so Elizabeth

Now, the first book of town records at Falmouth on the Cape gives the birth dates of four children of a Nathaniel Baker, who thereafter disappears from Falmouth records. His wife is not named. The children's births were listed as:

- 2. Benjamin 23 May 1742
- 3. Hannah 6 May 1744
- 4. Nathaniel 12 Jan. 1746

It would seem that this was the same Nathaniel who was later at Yarmouth, and that three of the children were by an earlier wife than Temperance. The fact that nothing further is known of any of the four children named above may suggest that they all died in infancy. There is a discrepancy, too, between the birth dates of the last child born in Falmouth and the first one born in Yarmouth. Perhaps the Nathaniel born in Falmouth was born 12 Jan. 1745/6; and Lydia born 1 Jan. 1746/7. It is noticeable, too, that although Nathaniel and Temperance lived in Marmouth, practically all their children settled in Falmouth: a fact that lends credence to my theory. I am, therefore, regarding Nathaniel of Falmouth and Hathaniel of Yarmouth as one and the same man -- and it may some time be shown that in this I am wrong.

When the widow Alice wrote her will I June 17803(proved ?21 July 1783) she mentioned none of the sons, but only the daughter Sarah's family--Sarah herself, her husband, and their children. So it may be that only Sarah was Alice's child. The witnesses to Alice's will were Benjamin Chub, Ezra Chub, and Moses Buffington, Samuel was probably alive as late as 22 Feb. 1770% When Benjamin Baker of Mew Bedford (he with the wife Hartha -- see page 30) sold land in Swansea on that date, the land was described as adjoining land of Samuel Baker -- not of "Samuel Baker, dec'd," as would have been the usual phrase if Samuel were not alive. The fact that this Benjamin's land bordered Samuel's makes one wonder if they were not very near of kin. Samuel also had a later wife named Sarahy whom he married probably about 1788 His home was in Dennis.5 He would seem surely to be the Samuel Baker of the 1790 census who is listed as having in his household at that time one male under sixteen and five females. 51 George 4 (Joseph 3 Daniel 2) is an unsclued puzzle, and his solution has been made the more difficult because he has been badly confused with a George Bakor of an unrelated line. His age is not known, even approximately. Because he was the first son named in the settlement of his father's estate, and also because he seems not to have been given a guardian when his brothers were, he may have been the oldest child. However, when his brother Joseph's estate was distributed, George was named last of the four living brothers; and when his sister Isabel's es-tate was divided he was named third of the four; so that the names order loses most of its significance -- and he may even have been the joungest child, possibly posthumous, which same may be said of his brother Samuel. In fact, the late birth date would seem to suit better the time when Ceorge's name first jets into land records. All we have found out concerning him follows: On 11 Apr. 17576 Occree Baker of Smithfield sold ten acres of land in Swansea: no



59 Philip 4 (Elisha 3 Daniel 2) son of Elisha and Mary I (Harle) was born, we should surmise, about 1712 or 1714. On 29 Apr. 17387his father deeded him for love a messuage and fifty acres of land in Scituate. This may mark the approximate time of Philip's marriage to a wife named Hannah; but they seem not to have resided on the Scituate property. For two or three years Philip was still of Providence (the part soon to be known as Granston) engaging in sevieral land deals. On 15 Jan. 1740/14 he bought a place in Matick, a section of Warwick, and lived there from then on. At the time of the 1774 census his household included, besides himself and wife, one male over and one under 16 and one female over 18-a list hard to make tally. Philip's will was written 28 Aug. and proved 7 Dec. 1775. This willow Hannah on 11 Apr. 1782 0 ade arrangements with Daniel Baker of Scituate (son of Philip's brother Elishe) by which she was to have rooms in his house for the rest of her life. One wonders if there may not have been kinship between Hannah and Daniel's wife, Sarah Westcott. All of Hannah's children were given good Westcott names--Oliver, Jeremiah, and Mathan being wholly new names in the Warwick line of Dakers to which Philip belonged. In one deed we note that Philip is referred to as "Captain Philip."

Since in the 1782 consus his age is given as between 26 and 50, he was not born earlier than 1732. He may have been married four times. Three of his marriages are recorded in Cranston vital records, the dates being 1760, 1769, and 1780. But the 1774 census gives him a family of four males and three females over 10; three males and four females under 16. That is besides himself and wife there were in his family five children over 16; and therefore born before 1758, when he could not have been over 26 years old. Since no such early marriage for him has been found and since no mention is made of any such children in his will, it seems most likely that he was sheltering in his home the orphaned family of some kinsman or neighbor. Eleanor has been called the daughter of Josiah and Eunice (Chandler). The 1782 consus gives Joseph two sons and two daughters under 16; three sons and one daughter between 13 and 22; one daughter of 22 or over; and shows that both Joseph and his wife were under 50. By the 1790 consus they had four sons over and four under 16; six daughters; and three slaves. Not nearly all these children are named in Josephia will, but that was written when he was a very old man, and there had probably been deaths in the family. The will was dated 4 Feb. 1807 and proved 28 Feb. 1818. Some named in it are not specifically called sons, but probably were such. A deed in Granston town hall dated 1 July 1773 and another dated 13 June 1783 were signed by both Joseph and his wife "Illen," but when he deeded land in Warwick to his son Earl on 7 Mar. 1803 there was no wife signature, from which we infer that Eleanor was probably then no longer alive. Although it is most unusual to find the case of a boy of sixteen marrying a woman of 22, we believe that in this case it happened. The following circumstance lends a little credence to this hypothesis: In 1789 Ezekiel Taylor of this same town of Ashfield in northwestern Massachusetts came to Cape Cod and married at Yarmouth Mary Baker third cousin once removed to Zephaniah 5 above. That is, there was already a beaten track from Yarmouth to Ashfield, and a family connection. The oldest son married at Sunderland in 1832, after which this Baker group moved West. "Since the son's wife died in Nebraska, it is likely that it was in that state the others lived.

All that is given here must be regarded as tentative only, and subject to revision. 156 William 5 (Elisha 4 & 3 Daniel 2) son of Elisha and Mary (Burton) must have been born after the writing of his Grandfather Baker's will, 17 Mar. 1756 else the latter could not have bequeathed to "my grandson William Baker" (meaning Philip's son William) without further identification. Elisha 4 left the bulk of his estate to this son William, most of the other nine children having received their portions. We have regarded this William as the one who married at Warwick 24 Dec. 1789 Ruth LeValley, daughter of Peter and Mary (Haynes). But we call attention to the family group discussed on page 134, which makes it seem possible -- perhaps even probable -- that Daniel Baker of Warwick(# 152)may have had a son William with wife Ruth. If William and Ruth(LeValley) belong to the Daniel group, then we have no further data on Elisha's son William. There may have been two Williams, both with wives named Ruth. - Although Elizabeth Baker, wife of John Nickerson, p. 3 is said by Mr. Eardeley-Thomas in the introduction to the Twining Genealogy (1905 ed.) to have died in 1711; this must be an error; for she was alive when her fa-ther wrote his will on 25 Apr. 1712.
- Eleazer O'Kelley's will was written 4 Dec. 1775 and p.9 proved 16 Dec. of the same year.
- p.10 Eleazer O'Kelley, Jr., was born 1 Nov. 1728.
- Mercy Cahoon, wife of Elisha Baker, was daughter of p.22 William and Sarah (O'Killey) of Harwich. She married Elisha in 1735, he being of Yarmouth. Mercy was born 7 May 1717.
- p.22 Josiah Baker lost a child 2 months old at Portland on 23 July 1782; And the "Columbian Sentinel" of 23 Aug. 1817 gives the obituary of a Josiah Baker who died at Portland aged 45, so born 1772 and most likely a scn of Josiah and Lydia (Merrill).

BAKER FAMILY CHARACTERISTICS

The early generations of Bakers on the Cape were largely sea-faring men. Many have the ocean as their grave. Miss
Florence Baker in her "Yesterday's Tide" loves to name the
Bakers who were captains of schooners, and of three-masted
schooners. Hosts of them were fishermen, especially mackerel
catchers; and it was a Baker of Dennis who invented the invaluable purse net. In the days of the famous clipper ships
Bakers brought glory to the family name as they raced other
clipper captains to ports of the Orient. It was a Baker who
was in command of the first steamboat to enter Boston harbor.

Bakers who migrated from the Cape to inland towns were engaged chiefly in trade and industry. Not many, in the first six generations, entered the learned professions or showed interest in higher education; but in business many became eminently successful, and this has remained true in later days. It is said of one of them that he amassed the largest estate (not inherited) ever left in New England.

In temperament, perhaps the word non-conformist best describes the rank and file of early Bakers. They did not see things just as their neighbors saw them: they observed for themselves and drew their own conclusions. This trait led many of them to join the Quakers and a few to become Baptists-both non-conformist groups. Some, beginning with Francis(1), have had a streak of hardness in their nature--as is often true of non-conformers.

Their inclination to think differently, and so to stay somewhat apart from others of the community is doubtless what led to the very noticeably large number of marriages between Bakers and their Baker cousins -- as the list on page 212 of our index shows. This tendency begins to disappear with the setting in of the great migrations to the west and north.

There is a marked and rather delightful individuality in the names early Bakers gave their children, especially their daughters. Thankful and Temperance; Patience and Reliance; Fear; Deliverance; Peace; Desire; Experience—these were names not much used by their neighbors, but the Bakers loved them. Perhaps it was their way of bringing religion—not church religion, but a very real and practical kind of idealism—into the home circle. For their sons they drew more on Bible names—like their neighbors in this, but even in the Bible they seem to have found names the neighbors overlooked. Judah and Jedediah; Shubael and Archelus (alwas thus spelled) were favorite masculine names; and in the Bible, too, they found the lovely name of Bethany for daughters.

Industrious; voluntarily choosers of occupations full of danger and demanding high courage; independent thinkers who were little swayed by popular superstitions or current propagands; hard be occasion; separatist in temperament, rather than social; religious in a homely, practical way; Cape Cod Bakers have passed on to those in whose veins their blood still flows qualities both good and not-so-good, but having at least a moisty of something not to be ashamed of.







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
